

For Walsall CCG GPs The ReSPECT go live date is fast approaching The roll out of the Recommended Summary Plan for Emergency Care and Treatment (ReSPECT) across Walsall is fast approaching. As of 1 January 2021 a ReSPECT form will need to be used instead of the current DNACPR form and will work alongside existing Advance Care Planning (ACP) forms and Treatment Escalation Plans used in Care Homes. Existing DNACPR forms will remain valid in the absence of a ReSPECT form, but new decisions should follow the ReSPECT process and be documented on the new form. It is really important that staff understand that the ReSPECT form captures much more information that just a decision on resuscitation and a patient may have a ReSPECT form and still be for all active treatment, including resuscitation. It is a national process established by the Resuscitation Council, which records personalised recommendations for clinical care in an emergency situation, when a person is not able to make decisions or express their wishes. Training for the rollout of ReSPECT As part of the process all patient facing staff are required to undertake a level of training dependant on their role: Authorship - aimed at those professionals that will be having ReSPECT conversations and completing and endorsing the patient held form Awareness - aimed at staff across health and social care organisations that come into contact with patients/service users The training is simple to follow and will take around 30 minutes maximum More information about ResPECT please email: walsall.together@walsallhealthcare.nhs.uk/respect If you have any questions about ResPECT please email: walsall.together@walsallhealthcare.nhs.uk/
